7. Parent Council Update
- 3rd Grade Reading Legislation - comes into effect this year. Chief Academic Officer for P-CCS, Beth Rayl wants all parents to take a deep breath. Of the 1,100 students that fall into the "Not Proficient" category in M-Step, only 2 children would be considered under this law. There are several exemptions that apply to IEPs, ELL, and more. It would not be a surprise to the parent, as contact will have been made all along at this point.
 - Bond Proposal: The district is presenting the first reading of a Bond Proposal to the School Board next Tuesday, Nov. 12th. The Bond is a continuation of the current Bond that is set to expire, so there will be no increase in taxes. If the School Board approves the Bond, it will be on the ballot in March. The Bond includes funding for a 10 year Facility Study that would create equity amongst the buildings at P-CCS. PROPOSED plans can be found on the district's website:
